DEVOTION: "EASY FOR HER"

Our own Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton recently told a story about something that happened when she was a

pastor serving a congregation and I'm delighted to retell it.

One Sunday, the ushers were solemnly taking up the collection as usual, and people were glumly doing their duty and putting their offering in the plate as usual.

A little girl in the assembly, seeing what was going on nudged her dad and pleaded (and pleaded and pleaded) until he gave in and dug into his wallet and handed her a bill so she could make an offering too.

The little girl ran up the aisle after the ushers waving the bill in the air, calling, "wait for me, wait for me! Here's mine! I want to put some in!" And as she dropped the money in the plate, she beamed with joy and then danced her way back to her dad's side.

Later, at coffee hour, Bishop Eaton...I mean Pastor Easton...was chatting with a parishioner and said, "wasn't that little girl beautiful? It would be so wonderful if everyone could give as joyfully."

And the parishioner said, "Well, it's easy for her... it's not her money!"

And Pastor Eaton replied: "No." And she paused...a pregnant pause...and then went on. "It's her father's."

If you've ever met Bishop Eaton, you can envision the twinkle in her eye as she tells that story. Cute as the story is, it carries a real theological message about giving.

In the parish where I grew up, we sang a little acclamation as the ushers carried our offerings up the aisle every Sunday: "All things come of thee, O Lord, and of thine own have we given thee."

That's the same message as Bishop Eaton story.

Everything we have comes to us from our loving and generous God, just as that little girl's offering came from her loving and generous dad. Everything. When we give to Women of the ELCA, when we make a contribution to Katie's Fund, when we make a designated gift through Women of the ELCA to Lutheran Disaster Response: Nepal, we are simply using what God has already given us to support God's work.

The little girl asked eagerly and gave joyfully. Can you imagine how she felt as she ran to support God's work with all she had? Can you imagine how she thanked her dad for making it possible?

Can you imagine doing the same?

The last part of April we sat in front of our television sets and watched the devastation of the worst quake to hit the Himalayan region in nearly a century One week after the quake, Lutheran World Relief reported more than 5,500 people had died and some 11,000 were injured ... they also reported they had sent **9,240 Quilts, 1,000 Personal Care Kits and 100 Water Filtration Units.** Women of the ELCA, we do make a difference! All of those hours spent cutting squares, sewing squares together and tying a quilt, packing those quilts up for shipping and finally getting them to the boxcars for loading let someone else know they are loved and cared for. Women of the ELCA we are indeed the hands, feet and voice of our Lord. THANK YOU!

A Message from the <u>Sy</u>nodical <u>W</u>omen's <u>O</u>rganization President

Be gentle with one another, sensitive, Forgive one another as quickly and thoroughly as God in Christ forgave you. Ephesians 4:32 ... the Message

Sisters in Christ,

To me the past couple of months have been filled with violence ... on the nightly news we hear of another person shot ... we watch the distrust between people and our police departments ... a fatal accident where alcohol was involved and the list goes on and on and on. Then, in the midst of this I received the following e-mail and it gives hope ... there is goodness, kindness and caring in our world.

At a fundraising dinner for a school that serves children with learning disabilities, the father of one of the students delivered a speech that would never be forgotten by all who attended. After extolling the school and its dedicated staff, he offered a question:

"When not interfered with by outside influences, everything nature does, is done with perfection. Yet my son, Shay, cannot learn things as other children do. He cannot understand things as other children do. Where is the natural order of things in my son?" The audience was stilled by the query.

The father continued. "I believe that when a child like Shay, who was mentally and physically disabled comes into the world, an opportunity to realize true human nature presents itself, and it comes in the way other people treat that child". Then he told the following story.

"Shay and I had walked past a park where some boys Shay knew were playing baseball. Shay asked, 'do you think they'll let me play?' I knew that most of the boys would not want someone like Shay on their team, but as a father I also understood that if my son were allowed to play, it would give him a much needed sense of belonging and some confidence to be accepted by others in spite of his handicaps.

I approached one of the boys on the field and asked (not expecting much) if Shay could play. The boy looked around for guidance and said, 'we're losing by six runs and the game is in the eighth inning. I guess he can be on our team and we'll try to put him in to bat in the ninth inning..'

Shay struggled over to the team's bench and, with a broad smile, put on a team shirt. I watched with a small tear in my eye and warmth in my heart. The boys saw my joy at my son being accepted. In the bottom of the eighth inning, Shay's team scored a few runs but was still behind by three. In the top of the ninth inning, Shay put on a glove and played in the right field. Even though no hits came his way, he was obviously ecstatic just to be in the game and

on the field, grinning from ear to ear as I waved to him from the stands. In the bottom of the ninth inning, Shay's team scored again. Now, with two outs and the bases loaded, the potential winning run was on base and Shay was scheduled to be next at bat.

At this juncture, do they let Shay bat and give away their chance to win the game?

Surprisingly, Shay was given the bat. Everyone knew that a hit was all but impossible because Shay didn't even know how to hold the bat properly, much less connect with the ball. However, Shay stepped up to the plate, the pitcher, recognizing that the other team was putting winning aside for this moment in Shay's life, moved in a few steps to lob the ball in softly so Shay could at least make contact. The first pitch came and Shay swung clumsily and missed. The pitcher again took a few steps forward to toss the ball softly towards Shay. As the pitch came in, Shay swung at the ball and hit a slow ground ball right back to the pitcher. The game would now be over.

The pitcher picked up the soft grounder and could have easily thrown the ball to the first baseman. Shay would have been out and that would have been the end of the game. Instead, the pitcher threw the ball right over the first baseman's head, out of reach of all team mates. Everyone from the stands and both teams started yelling, 'Shay, run to first! Run to first!'

Never in his life had Shay ever run that far, but he made it to first base. He scampered down the baseline, wideeyed and startled. Everyone yelled, 'Run to second, run to second!' Catching his breath, Shay awkwardly ran toward second, gleaming and struggling to make it to the base. By the time Shay rounded towards second base, the right fielder had the ball. The smallest guy on their team who now had his first chance to be the hero for his team. He could have thrown the ball to the second-baseman for the tag, but he understood the pitcher's intentions so he, too, intentionally threw the ball high and far over the third baseman's

TENTH TRIENNIAL CONVENTION

July 11-13, 2017

Minneapolis, Minnesota

The Triennial Convention is the highest legislative authority of Women of the ELCA. The primary responsibility of the **voting members** is to carry out the business of our organization. A variety of matters come before this convention including elections, the budget, memorials from Synodical Organization and resolutions from the floor.

Each Synodical Women's Organization is allowed to elect **one voting member** for every twenty-five (25) congregational, inter-congregational, or special UNITS.

We recently had to do an assessment of the UNITS in our Greater Milwaukee Synod. We found that we have fifty-nine (59) active UNITS so we will elect three (3) delegates plus our SWO President to represent us at the 10th Annual Triennial Convention. Our Greater Milwaukee **S**ynodical **W**omen's **O**rganization will have the election (to elect these three voting members) at their 2016 Annual SWO Convention.

Almost every congregation in our Synod has a women's ministry but we cannot count them as a Unit unless they commit to affirm to:

- ◆ The purpose statement of Women of the ELCA
- Come together to fulfill the purpose
- Participate in program activities of Women of the ELCA beyond their own individual UNIT
- Support financially the total program of Women of the ELCA (this means giving an offering of record ... remember that one-half of every offering sent to our Synodical Organization goes directly to Churchwide)
- ◆ Designate leadership to be in communication with the <u>Synodical Women's Organization</u> and the Churchwide Organization
- ♦ Have a Contact Person

TENTH TRIENNIAL GATHERING July 13-16, 2017 ... Minneapolis, Minnesota

Following the Triennial Convention women from all 65 Synods will **GATHER** together for inspirational speakers, workshops, a 5-k run and much, much more. Now is the time to begin planning to attend this event ... if you haven't already registered, do so soon. Your SWO Board has already purchased three (3) pre-registrations to be given out as scholarships and one (1) pre-registration for our first time voting member.

BACKPACKS FOR HOMELESS CHILDREN

In the Greater Milwaukee Synod

The following Resolution was passed last October by the women attending the Annual SWO Convention. Everyone is invited to participate ... Backpacks will be assembled in mid-August at Ascension Lutheran Church ... 1236 S. Layton Blvd ... Milwaukee, WI 53215



Whereas, homeless children miss the security that a home symbolizes and many people take for granted; and

Whereas, homeless children give up personal items when forced to move from place to place; and

Whereas, children deserve good health, good food, school support and play time; and

Whereas, the ELCA Churchwide asks church groups to participate in a hands-on service project in September; now, therefore, be it

Resolved, that Women of the ELCA Greater Milwaukee Synodical Women's Organization:

 encourages women in the Greater Milwaukee Synod to collect <u>backpacks of various sizes</u> throughout the year;

- 2. encourages women to collect necessary **school supplies** throughout the year;
- 3. encourages women to collect **toiletries** throughout the year;
- 4. encourages women to collect small personal <u>security</u> <u>items (stuffed toys "Beanie Baby" size), books,</u> <u>Matchbox cars, Nerf balls, or small, long-lasting flashlights).</u>
- 5. encourages women to collect <u>healthy</u>, <u>non-perishable</u> snacks in July, 2015, and be it

Further Resolved, that women gather in early August, 2015 to assemble items into backpacks for distribution to home-less children.

Because homeless children live in all areas of our Greater Milwaukee Synod, these "BACKPACKS" will be distributed to four locations within the Synod. **SHALOM HOUSE** in Kenosha ... somewhere in the **53206 zip code** in Milwaukee ...**Bridgeway & Beyond** (transitional Living Program for single mothers and children) in **Sheboygan**. We are still looking for a place in the Lake Country Cluster, if you have a suggestion please contact Betty Warber at 262-886-8918 or betty@warber.net.

In addition to the supplies, we'll need lots of hands to help fill the backpacks sometime in August. We'll try to get this information out to all the congregations in the Synod and hopefully, Pastors, Church Administrators and Secretaries will get the message to the women.




BEV ETZELMUELLER

head. Shay ran toward third base deliriously as the runners ahead of him circled the bases toward home. All were screaming, 'Shay, Shay, Shay, all the way Shay.' Shay reached third base because the opposing shortstop ran to help him by turning him in the direction of third base, and shouted, "run to third! Shay, run to third!" As Shay rounded third, the boys from both teams, and the spectators, were on their feet screaming, 'Shay, run home! Run home!' Shay ran to home, stepped on the plate, and was cheered as

the hero who hit the grand slam and won the game for his team.

'That day', said the father softly with tears now rolling down his face, 'the boys from both teams helped bring a piece of true love and humanity into this world'.

Shay didn't make it to another summer. He died that winter, having never forgotten being the hero and making me so happy, and coming home and seeing his mother tearfully embrace her little hero of the day!

We all have thousands of opportunities every single day to help realize the 'natural order of things.' So many seemingly trivial interactions between two people present us with a choice: Do we pass along a little spark of love and humanity or do we pass up those opportunities and leave the world a little bit colder in the process?
